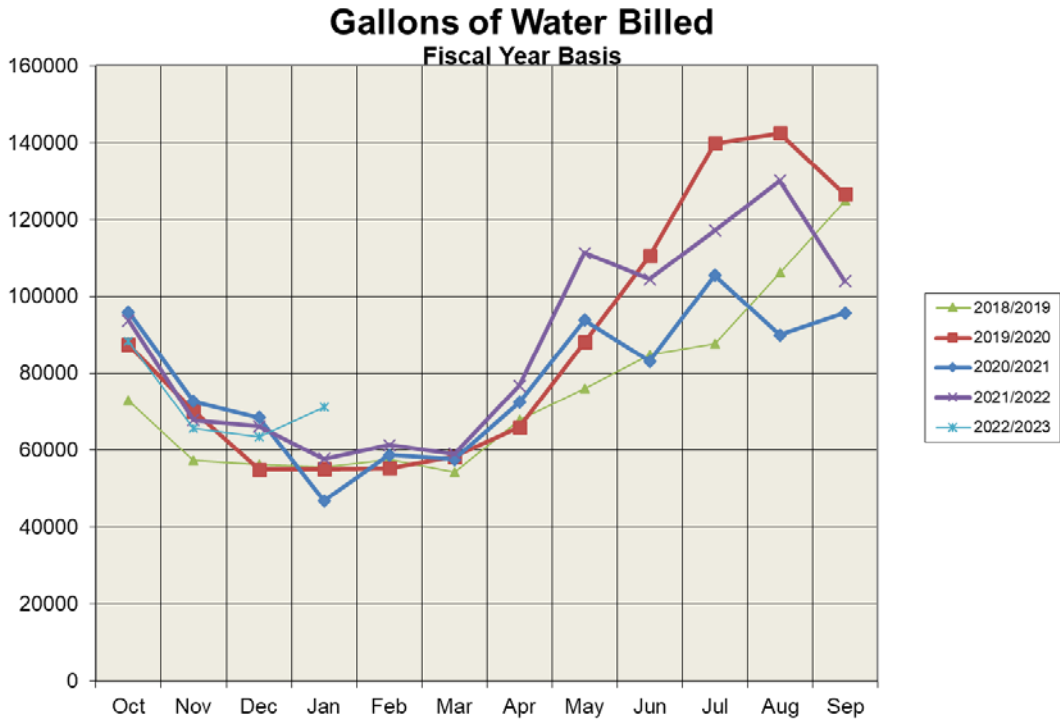

The Chief Librarian resumed her duties after her medical leave due to surgery.

The large number of materials withdrawn this month is a result of withdrawing Kindle titles from the catalog. The Kindles we have are very old and are no longer taking a charge. The circulation is basically zero, so we have opted to withdraw them all, as well as the titles we could download.

We are currently working on the forms for the new system. These forms will list our item types, location codes, and patron types. Then there will be the more tedious task of mapping the patrons to the types. We are adding several new categories to the patrons, which will help as we track demographics and other statistics.

We are waiting until the migration to make adjustments to the number of patrons registered and the item categories we will not be keeping. We will simply not move over that information. That will effectively purge our patron records as well as get rid of material categories we no longer need or want in our catalog.
